
The **Council of State Archivists** (CoSA) provides leadership to strengthen and support state and territorial archives leaders and staff in their work to preserve and provide access to government records.







Social Media Archiving Louisiana State Archives

- Policies for archiving or collecting social media data
 - Internally
 - Other agencies
- Ingest of social media records
- Planning for access

Social Media Archiving CoSA's Response

- Member survey
- Things we know
 - Social media usage is common practice in state governments (82%)
 - Laws and records retention requirements lack specific guidance for social media
 - Less than half (42%) reported harvesting or access to social media accounts after terms end

Social Media Archiving CoSA's Response

- Questions we're asking
 - Are social media posts public record?
 - Should comments and direct messages be considered public record/correspondence?
 - What are the ethical considerations for access?
 - How can we respond to "hostile" platforms that limit harvesting for preservation?

Social Media Archiving CoSA's Response

- Next Steps
 - Analysis of the survey responses (now)
 - Development of guidance documentation for primary issues (February – April)
 - Release and discussion of outcomes at virtual SERI STEER* Unconference (May 16)
