# Background

#### **Common Hurdles for UOCAVA Voters**

According to a 2012 report from a U.S. Department of Defense and NASS delegation that visited U.S. installations in the Middle East:

"The most common reason given for rejecting a UOCAVA ballot was that the ballot was not received on time or missed a deadline; States reported that 40.4 percent of rejected ballots were rejected for this reason."

The report also identified the following hurdles for active service members, their families, and overseas citizens:

- Lack of access to certain technology required to print, mark and return registration and balloting materials (i.e. printer or scanner);
- Need for a single point of contact; and
- Unreliable mail systems.



# Background

#### **Solutions**

EASE is a one-stop-shop that seamlessly integrates registration, ballot request, and ballot marking into a single online resource available 24/7 before an election.

For UOCAVA voters, EASE eliminates:

- The need for access to certain technology to exercise the right to vote;
- Dependency on "snail mail";
- Confusion by acting as the single resource for UOCAVA voters;
- The need to engage in multiple communications with local election officials; and
- The need for UOCAVA voters to contact local election officials on Nevada time.



### EASE

#### **One-Stop-Shop**

As a completely electronic online resource, EASE eliminates the need for a user to have access to a printer in order to sign their documents with a wet signature, as well as a scanner or fax machine to return their completed materials.

Similar to Online Voter Registration, EASE accomplishes this goal by:

- Collecting basic information from a UOCAVA voter;
  - A Common Access Card (CAC) card can used to facilitate this process, but is not required.
- Determining what, if any, additional information we need to know about the user; and
- Providing the user with all of their registration and balloting materials, including the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA).
