Alabama Votes Photo Voter ID Initiative



What is the Alabama Votes Photo Voter ID Initiative?

The Alabama Votes Photo Voter ID (PVI) Initiative is a project that was established by Secretary of State John H. Merrill upon his election as Alabama's 53rd Secretary of State in 2015.

The initiative seeks to provide free photo voter ID cards to Alabama's voters and promote voter registration and voter participation.

Why was this initiative established?

Upon taking office as Alabama's 53rd Secretary of State, Secretary Merrill realized that there was a need to promote voter registration and photo voter identification throughout the state. Only 2,992,062 of Alabama's 4.8 million residents were registered to vote at the time of his election in 2015, and Secretary Merrill believed there was room for improvement because so many eligible citizens were not registered to vote and weren't aware of the many resources that are available to them.

The program seeks to encourage as many eligible Alabamians as possible to register to vote and exercise their right to vote, and those who do not possess a valid form of identification to vote are encouraged to apply for a free photo voter ID card through the Alabama Secretary of State's Office or the Board of Registrars. The program also seeks to make the voter registration and photo voter ID process as convenient and accessible as possible.

How are free photo voter identification cards and voter registration promoted to gain the public's interest and attention?

To spark the interest of the people, the Alabama Secretary of State's Office recruits two renowned public figures each year to appear on collectible posters and television and radio ads throughout the State of Alabama. The public figures are not paid for their appearances.



PVI Mobile Unit Visits

The Secretary of State's Office has mobile units that travel the state to provide voter registration and photo voter identification cards to eligible citizens, as well as distribute the posters, at festivals, sporting events, such as football and basketball games, and wherever elected officials and interested community members may suggest. Both the posters and the ads provide information on how to apply for a free photo voter ID and how to register to vote via the Secretary of State's website and the Vote for Alabama mobile app.




















Online Voter Registration & the Vote for Alabama App

The Vote for Alabama app and voter registration online portal were created by the Information Systems staff within the Secretary of State's Office in 2016. Prior to Secretary Merrill's administration, electronic voter registration did not exist in Alabama. Since the launch of the online registration portal and the app, more than 1.5 million Alabamians have registered to vote electronically.

How has the program impacted voter registration and participation?

- 96% of all eligible African Americans are registered to vote.
- 91% of all eligible white Americans are registered to vote.
- 94% of all eligible Alabamians as a whole are registered to vote.
- Almost 2.1 million citizens have registered to vote in the state since the program's implementation in 2015, which sets the total to almost 3.7 million registered voters in Alabama.

Alabama has broken voter participation records in every election since 2016:

- 1.2 million voters participated in the 2016 Presidential Primary Election.
- 2.1 million participated in the 2016 Presidential General Election.
- 1.3 million voters participated in the 2017 Special Senate Election.
- 1.7 million voters participated in the 2018 Gubernatorial Election.
- 1.1 million voters participated in the 2020 Presidential Primary Election.
- 2.3 million voters participated in the 2020 Presidential General Election.

Photo Voter ID Cards

For the past seven years, the Secretary of State's mobile units and the Boards of Registrars throughout Alabama's 67 counties have collectively produced more than 25,000 free photo voter identification cards for Alabamians across the state.
