- Communities of color are targeted by rampant misinformation tactics
- Voters in these communities are not sure who or what to believe





The power of a trusted voice

- Saw immediate value in working with local leaders at community conversations
- Called upon the voices of trusted messengers to share factual election information and debunk misinformation
- Enter the Truth Tellers Task Force* (*working name)

Makeup of the task force

- Task Force to include 25-30 members from across the state
- Made up of clergy; leadership from the Divine 9; small business owners; and representatives from nonpartisan organizations
- Representatives from communities more likely to be targeted by misinformation/disinformation campaigns

Makeup of the task force (continued)

- Potential members also include pro-democracy partners from previous initiatives
- Individuals must be willing to undergo training in Michigan election law, procedures, and newly enshrined rights and available to speak to audiences and share election facts and resources
