
Michigan Department of State Freedom of Information Act Portal

Freedom of Information Act, MCL 15.231 et seq, Act 442 of 1976

- Applies to all public bodies, however, the governor's office and legislature are not subject to FOIA.
- Provides strict response deadlines.
- Allowable fees include up to 50% of the fringe benefits cost of the processor.
- A number of exemptions exist, ranging from information of a personal nature to cybersecurity plans to information protected from disclosure under other state statutes.
- Requestors may appeal denials and fee estimates or immediately file litigation,

Security

- Automatic routing of requests to business areas
