250th Celebration at the Archives



Museum Exhibitions





- **Historic documents on the move:** Bringing original Founding-era records—including a rare 1823 engraving of the Declaration of Independence, the Treaty of Paris, and early Constitutional drafts—to eight cities across the U.S. for the first time.
- **Flying across America:** Documents will travel to 8 major cities via a specially branded Boeing 737, connecting communities nationwide to the history that shaped the nation.
- **Free and open to the public:** Each stop on the tour will offer free access to these rare artifacts, making America's founding history accessible to everyone.

America's 100 Docs Sweet 16


February 1-March 15, 2026



- **History goes head-to-head:** 16 of America's most significant historical records from the holdings of the National Archives face off in a bracket-style Sweet 16 championship.
- **Beyond just "docs:"** Records range from iconic photographs, treaties, Supreme Court cases, and more, representing various eras of American history from the Founding Era through 9/11.
- **National public voting decides the winner:** Americans fill out brackets and vote each week as documents advance from the Sweet 16 to a single national champion, or in this case, "America's Top Doc."

Spirit of Independence Festival

June 4-6, 2026



- **Family & Community Events:** Throughout the festival, there will be art, games, hourly programs, and even a “Yappy Hour” for furry friends.
- **Honoring Service & Heritage:** Salute to Service will pay tribute to U.S. military members; American Mosaic: State Dinner Cookout and American Opportunity black-tie dinner will showcase regional cuisine, celebrity chefs, and entertainment.
- **Festive Experiences:** Guests will enjoy interactive chef and cocktail stations, engaging conversations with historical interpreters of Founding figures, special museum-specific activations, and more surprises!

The American Story



Ongoing, National Archives Museum



- **A new signature museum experience:** *The American Story* is the National Archives Museum's newly opened permanent exhibition, redesigned for the first time in over 20 years to celebrate 250 years of U.S. history.
- **Personalized, interactive journey:** Powered by artificial intelligence, the exhibit lets visitors choose topics they care about and receive personalized content drawn from more than two million digitized records.
- **Original documents and artifacts:** Highlights include George Washington's annotated Constitution, the Louisiana Purchase Treaty, notable patents, photographs, and Presidential gifts from foreign dignitaries.
- **Discovery Center:** Just across the Rotunda, the Discovery Center offers hands-on, interactive games and activities designed to engage children, families, teachers, and students of all ages with history in a playful way.

Coming May 2026




- **Celebrating independence:** Explores the events, people, and ideals that led to the signing of the Declaration of Independence and highlights how Americans have celebrated July 4 and milestone anniversaries over the centuries.
- **Rare documents and artifacts:** Visitors will see a Dunlap Broadside (shown above), the Lee Resolution, King George III's proclamations, journals from the First Continental Congress, and the National Archives' working model of the original Declaration vault.
- **Reflecting on past commemorations:** Will feature unique and interesting memorabilia, as well as films and audio from past "milestone" birthdays, namely the 1976 Bicentennial
